Chris Klicka has been working with homeschooled teens since 1994, when he directed HSLDA's intern program. In this session, Chris challenges homeschool teens to stay committed to the Lord. Experienced in fighting against the tide in the courts and the legislatures, Chris gives teens a straight talk about the importance of being a light in a dark world and standing for Jesus against the culture. He points them toward the necessity of mastering a biblical worldview and shows them how to discern in the areas of dress, friends, entertainment, college, etc., emphasizing the biblical admonition "to be in the world but not of it."

Homeschools At Risk with "Change" in Government -Friday

Chris Klicka talks about the dangers facing homeschools from the powers that control our federal government and many state legislatures.
